Congratulations to our Golden Ticket winner – Jack for great work in maths this week.

This week ... in Crenver Class the children have been exploring the use of brackets when solving number problems and the effect of multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100. In literacy, the children have been investigating the features of non-chronological report writing and the use of commas and the semi-colon in lists. Today the children had a visitor from the Camborne School of Mines to support their learning as part of the history project. **Pengelly** – This week in Pengelly we have been working on writing our Journey stories. We have been concentrating on building the tension in our spooky stories. We can't wait to see how they turn out. In Art this week we have been learning and improving our painting techniques. We've been learning about shades and tones and the subtle effects of using black and white in colours. Also we have been experimenting with creating different colours using specific reds, blues and yellows and came up with some interesting effects.

Trenoweth – We have had a busy week in Trenoweth class with lots of new learning. In Literacy, we have been writing our stories based on The Three Billy Goats Gruff, focusing particularly on the use of interesting vocabulary and similes. The Year 2's have been learning how to use speech marks. In Numeracy, we have been learning to order numbers and place them on a numberline. The Year 2's have learnt to use 'greater than' and 'less than' symbols. In Science, we have continued observing the results of our experiment - looking at the conditions needed for plant growth.

Releath – This week Releath have been learning the letters e, u, r & h and the number 5. We have been sequencing the story of the Gingerbread man and were fortunate enough to have George's Mummy come in to help us cook our own Gingerbread Men! Thank you Mrs Heath, the children have also written some instructions about how they did it! We have been taking photos in IT to see how well we can take a photo and practising one more/one less up to 12. Today, the children have enjoyed making some clothes for our dolls and practising their throwing & tidying up!

Pupil Premium Funding – From next half-term we have decided to use the government's Pupil Premium Funding to remove the financial barrier to qualifying children taking part in after-school sports clubs and from accessing private musical tuition hosted by the school. If your child currently claims a free school meal or has in the past 6 years, is from a service family, is adopted or has been in care (a 'looked after' child) then please contact Mrs. Coates in the school office.

This will potentially save the parents of these Pupil Premium children the fees for:

Mini-tennis (Tuesdays)

Brass/woodwind instrument tuition (Wednesdays) Drum tuition (Thursdays)

Jamie Thomson's football club (Fridays)

*Children claiming their free school meal entitlement can already qualify for a subsidy on music lessons delivered by Cornwall Music staff, i.e. keyboards and guitars.

Please remember that it is important to claim a free school meal entitlement even if your child is currently entitled to a meal under the universal infant free school meal scheme otherwise the school will not receive the Pupil Premium Funding from the government to support your child's education.

Adult Learning Classes – Ever wanted to know how to support your child's learning in maths? Not sure about what methods are used in school today? Now there is an opportunity for you to find out! For a series of 5 weeks, David Reed will be leading a FREE course for parents and carers called KUC (Keeping up with your Children) Maths course. From Monday 10th November the group will meet at 9am to 11am in the school library. Registration forms are available from Mrs. Coates (Family Learning can fund your child-care while you attend the course, as long as your child is with a registered childminder)
