Releath Class - Wednesday, 19th October at 9.15 am **Trenoweth Class -** Friday, 4th November at 9.10 am **Pengelly Class -** Wednesday, 23rd November at 9.10 am **Crenver Class -** Wednesday, 16th November at 9.10 am This week...in Crenver – The children wrote a recount for their 'Big Write' about their trip to Pendennis Castle on Monday which forms part of their historical study of Tudor life. The Year 6 children enjoyed a further trip to Camborne Science & International Academy on Thursday morning to learn about scientific processes as part of the 'Flash! Bang! Wallop!' workshop. In mathematics, the class have been continuing to develop their skills in working with negative numbers and place value (including decimals). The Sports4More focus this week was 'Perseverance' with footage of Derek Redmond in the 1992 Olympic Games illustrating this quality. In RE, the children have begun to make plan drawings of their own cathedral building with annotated notes to highlight the special features they would wish to include.

Pengelly – Thank you to all the children in Pengelly class for such a lovely trip to Pendennis Castle on Monday. Your behaviour was excellent and hopefully you learnt a lot about the Tudors while we were there, as well as all the other ways the castle has been used. This week in maths we have worked hard on our place value knowledge again and have been learning that this year we are going to need to develop our resilience when solving. We are Years 3 and 4 now; the answer is not always going to be obvious.

Trenoweth – In maths, this week we have been learning

about partitioning – that numbers are made up of hundreds, tens and units. In Literacy, we have been sequencing the story of Little Red Riding Hood. We have started our topic of Plants in Science, by thinking about what we already know about plants and we discussed what we would like to find out. We had a fantastic time at the cathedral on Wednesday. The children sang their songs for World Peace Day beautifully and made Miss Phillips very proud.

As always, the children demonstrated excellent behaviour and showed they are a credit to our school. A very big thank you to Mrs Earle, Miss Lawlor, Miss Judge and Mrs Ellis for helping with transport. We hope you managed to catch the children singing on Wednesday night's Spotlight (hopefully still available on BBC iplayer).

Releath – We have had a lovely week in Releath class, learning the letter sounds i, n, m and d and have been really impressed at the children's enthusiasm to practise learning their sounds at home, well done! We have explored 2D shapes, ordering and recognising numbers, cones and leaves to 10, baking apple pie and searching for bugs for our bug hotel! Next Tuesday (27th September), we will be going for a shape and numbers hunt around the village, leaving school at 9:15am, and we would love for you to join us if
