This week...in Crenver Class - The 'Alma' animation has certainly captured our imaginations and made our creativity soar. Once finished and 'purple polished', the class are typing up their stories. We can't wait to read them! Together with our other 'polished' stories, we will be typing up our best writing to date to make our own anthology. We will work on this next week, with typing up and illustrating being done after this.

Our revision timetable continues, with Early Morning Maths on different areas; SPAG revision; Maths lesson and then English. We have been doing SPAG and Guided Reading before afternoon assembly so we are free for non-core subjects after break. All the hard work is paying off – keep it up Crenver!

Pengelly – This week in numeracy we have been working hard on finding the difference between two numbers and also tackling telling the time! The children have worked extremely hard and have really impressed me with their time telling skills. In Literacy, we have been looking at the features of persuasive letters, which was very tricky. However, the children made great progress and managed to produce their own marking ladders! Pengelly are making a fantastic start with their animal compositions. We even have some conductors in the class! Brilliant work this week Pengelly. Well done!

Trenoweth – The children have been working really hard during another busy week in Trenoweth class. The Year 1's have been adding and subtracting 11 from two digit numbers and begun adding and subtracting to the nearest multiple of 10. The Year 2's have been partitioning 2 and 3 digit numbers using place value and doubling larger numbers. In our Literacy lessons we have carried on writing the middle and the end of our own stories, using the structure from The Three Little Pigs to help us. We have been making our writing more exciting by using adverbs, adjectives and conjunctions to make our sentences longer. We have also started using inverted commas, making sure to use them when someone is speaking. In Science, we have been learning about the four different seasons and discussing, predicting and

writing what we might see outside our bedroom windows for each season. We have had another fantastic swimming lesson and are all very impressed by how much more confident the children are becoming each week.

Releath – This week we have been busy learning how to measure and weigh items using standard and non-standard units and all enjoyed cutting up doughnuts to learn about fractions today! We have written some amazing stories using our own story maps, based on 'Where the Wild Things Are'. We can't believe how well everybody is doing with their handwriting, well done Releath class! We have talked about clothes that we would need to pack for going on a hot or cold holiday and have learnt about climate zones across the globe.

**Sports News** – The school football team played Connor Downs at home last night and won impressively by 6 goals to 4.

This week has been Girls' Football Week and Mrs. Ellis has been running a lunchtime tournament between three teams. There have been some impressive skills on show and some excellent competition. The eventual winners were: The Red Team - Emma, Isabella, Imogen, Daisy, Lilly and Isla. Well done girls.

Mrs. Ellis has also now started a Bowls group after school on Fridays at Helston Bowls Club and it is hoped that the players will soon be able to take part in a competition against other school children in The Cornwall School Games.

**Governor News** – Mrs. Forwood completed a governor monitoring visit this week to explore the use of the Pupil Premium funding and its impact upon the experiences and learning of the eligible pupils. There is information about the Pupil Premium on the school website. Letters have been sent to all families of children eligible for **the Pupil Premium** funding to help us to determine future initiatives to support these pupils.

There will be a meeting of the Full Governing Body next week to approve the school budget for 2016-17.

Mrs. Glover will be making a governor monitoring visit to the school next Friday to explore the provision made for children with **special educational needs** within the school and to discuss what more could be done to achieve the best outcomes for these pupils.

The Educational Psychologist will be leading staff training on Tuesday, 10<sup>th</sup> May exploring how best to support adopted children and those with attachment issues.

The Southerly Point Trust schools were advised this week that the Academy Orders have been approved by the Department for Education and that the way is clear for the cluster to proceed with plans to form a new multi-academy trust.
