**This week...in Crenver** – The children have produced some examples of persuasive writing during their 'Big Write' to sell their chosen holiday destinations to the public. They have been working on activities linked to mental and written strategies in addition and subtraction within their numeracy lessons, and have labeled and read about the different parts of St.Paul's Cathedral as part of their Religious Education studies. The Sports 4More session this afternoon had a focus on communication.

Pengelly – This week we have been working really hard to write our first stories based on Sir Frances Drake's adventures. The class have worked hard to challenge themselves with their writing, pushing themselves out of their comfy bubbles. Also this week, we have been experimenting with our pencil techniques, drawing shapes and patterns that remind us of different weathers. Then we had to guess what each other had drawn – very tricky. Trenoweth – Another busy week in Trenoweth class, with lots of learning going on! We are having a big focus on spelling, learning to read and spell the big list of words the children are expected to learn by the end of the year. Also, in Literacy we have been learning how to use really interesting adjectives to describe our characters and setting. In maths, we have continued with our learning about partitioning and adding. As part of our topic work on plants, the children have worked with Mrs. Cleave to produce an excellent display of flowers and bees in our classroom! Please feel free to come and have a look at it next time you are in Trenoweth! Today, we have started the '99 club' maths, which the children are all very excited about. We have started on the '11 club' where the children have to answer 11 addition sums in 10 minutes. If they succeed, they move on to the '22 club' where they have to answer 22 questions in 10 minutes, and so on until they reach the '99 club'. Good luck everyone!

**Releath** – We have had another lovely week in Releath class. All of the children have been working so hard to learn the new letter sounds 'h,b,ff,l,ll and ss'. We have been exploring repeating patterns by making fruit kebabs, using shells, stones and cones outside and by playing a repeating melody with the musical instruments. We had a brilliant time making junk models of mini-beasts and have been amazing at using the laptops to explore phonics games, well done Releath class!
