**Governor News** – At the Extraordinary Governor meeting last night, it was agreed to continue to move towards becoming an academy school as part of the planned Southerly Point Multi-Academy Trust. The governing bodies of all the other 14 schools currently within the Southerly Point Trust have also elected to proceed towards forming a MAT.

This week...in Crenver Class...the children have been investigating which substances dissolve and are therefore soluble and which materials don't; insoluble materials. They have been writing autobiographies as celebrities and describing their thoughts and feelings during major events they have experienced. The children have also been very busy undertaking various assessments to help us decide where they need to go next with their learning. **Pengelly** – This week we have been learning about the Paleolithic stage of the Stone Age. In Literacy we wrote about our paintings of Stone Age life and our own crayon cave drawings. We worked really hard to include lots of quality features in our writing. Later in the week, we learnt about the changes that started to happen into the Mesolithic Stage. We created our own villages, showing all these developments. See our finished models on the website. **Trenoweth** – What a busy week! We had a fantastic time at the multi-skills festival at Camborne School on Wednesday. The children's behaviour was excellent and they thoroughly enjoyed the activities and winning their medals. In Literacy, the children have been writing instructions about how to make a pancake and they had fun making them on Shrove Tuesday. The children learned all about Lent and many of them promised to give up sweets and chocolate until Easter! You will have to let us know if they succeed! We hope you all have a lovely half term and we look forward to seeing you all in a week! **Releath** – This week, the children have enjoyed learning about Chinese New Year and the beginning of Lent. We made a delicious Chinese stir fry on Monday and the whole class had a go at being a Chinese Dragon! We played some Chinese music and sang songs. On Tuesday we made our own pancakes and talked about why we have Shrove Tuesday and 'doing something helpful for others' during Lent. The Year 1 children went to CISA to compete in a BHF Multiskills Tournament and all came back with a medal, we were very impressed! Y1 have also been looking at place value and separating numbers in to tens and units, and we have all been matching capital to lower case letters and learning the letter names. We have been talking about farm animals and their babies and how we can classify animals. The reception children had a great time hunting for minibeasts around our school and thinking about how we could sort them, e.g. has wings/has no wings, has 8 legs/has 6 legs. We really enjoyed getting some new books at our book swap today and loved tasting all of the foods that you made together at home, thank you! After the holidays, we will be exploring Julia Donaldson books, so please feel free to look at these together over half term. We have also noticed that the Eden Project are running a 'Stick man' activity week and would love to hear all about it if you manage to get that far to see it! As always, thank you for all of your support this half term, the children continue to make us so proud with their progress every day. Have a lovely half term :)
